**Writing** - We will be continuing with the our Writing Reviews unit and will start Nonfiction Writing in a few weeks.

The mini lessons for Review Writing will include:

Fairy Tales: This month we will begin our unit by making a list of all the Fairy Tales students know. Next we will discuss the characteristics of a Fairy Tale and what makes a Fairy Tale. During the next two months we will read and write Fairy Tales. We will culminate the unit by holding a Fairy Tale Ball on Wednesday, April 12th. **Math:** We will continue to work on fact power. The first part of the month the focus will be on Addition Fact Strategies and later this month the focus will be on Subtraction Strategies. Our math program uses games as a means of generating many exercises for learning basic math facts. I am always sensitive to the issue of competition with games. There are many good things fair competition can generate: excitement independence, and challenge. Games are an enjoyable way of practicing certain number skills. They reinforce the power of mental arithmetic and are an alternative to drill fact sheets.

**Science:** We will be starting our unit on Sound. Mrs. Keating will also be integrating this unit into her Music Class.
